Emily S. Weinstein is a Research Fellow at Georgetown's Center for Security and Emerging Technology (CSET), focused on U.S. national competitiveness in Artificial Intelligence/Machine Learning (AI/ML) technology and U.S.-China technology competition. She is also a Nonresident Fellow at the Atlantic Council's Global China Hub and the National Bureau of Asian Research.

In her previous role at CSET, Emily conducted research on China's Science & Technology (S&T) ecosystem, talent flows, and technology transfer issues. Emily has previously testified before the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission and the Wisconsin State Legislature's Senate Committee on Universities and Technical Colleges. She has written on topics related to research security and China's S&T developments in Foreign Policy, Lawfare, DefenseOne, and other outlets. Emily holds a B.A. in Asian Studies from the University of Michigan and an M.A. in Security Studies from Georgetown University.
