Results

The team members offered several papers at national and international conferences and interviews with national and international media. The Project follows a comparative perspective, namely on the basis of the following case-studies about the borderland between Ethiopia and Eritrea; Angola and Namibia; and Senegal and Guinea Bissau (Casamance). In this context I will undertake fieldwork on the Northern region of Ethiopia (Tigray) in a border area close to Eritrea. The aim of the case-study is to understanding the changes in the border's previous porous nature since its closure in the aftermath of the 1998-2000 border war between the two countries. The study will generate original data, based on fieldwork, on the changes and continuities with regards to borderland groups' identities. The period of analysis will be restricted to the aftermath of the 1998-2000 war which led to the closure of the border (2000-2011).

Project's summary: The Project focused on selected case- studies in the following countries: Angola, Mozambique, Ghana and Ethiopia. The Project followed a comparative methodology to provide an analysis of the participation of local actors in the process of building political spaces in rural areas and in their articulation with national political actors, such as the state and political parties. The comparison between Angola, Mozambique and Ethiopia and Ghana aimed at understanding local and rural actors ' responses to models of state building; aiming to assess the legacy of the socialist regimes and the changes and continuity since the transition to multiparty politics in these countries.

Tasks: I undertook field work in areas and carried out interviews and participant observation in Ethiopia's Tigray Region and I contributed with papers at Conferences and publications output. Within the project I undertook two fieldwork trips. The first took place in 2007 (November-December) and the second in 2008 (August-September).

Research Output: I contributed to the annual reports on the Project's Progress, participated at International Conferences to disseminate and discuss the Research's findings and I have contributed to the Project's publications forthcoming output: (1) chapter in the Project's final book.

Project's Outcomes: The team comprised well-established scholars, researchers and ongoing PhD students. The team members completed fieldwork successfully, the data analysis and the final report. In the course of the Project its members participated at Conferences both in Portugal and abroad, organised joint International Conferences in partnership with other research Institutions outside Portugal, organised Panels and offered papers in International Conferences, published articles

in academic journals, edited books and a book with the Research's findings (forthcoming). The Project's findings were disseminated to a wider audience, namely: students at various levels, other scholars both in Portugal and abroad, and, finally, the general public through the local media. The final meeting of the Project resulted in the discussion of individual research findings, of the methodological challenges and constraints and on commonalities and differences between the case-studies in a comparative perspective. The Project's major achievement in terms of contribution to the generation of knowledge was its valuable and original comparative perspective on the structuring of political spaces in rural areas in less studied field cases.
